
Then on November 20th, we will be showing Disney / Pixar's "Inside Out."

HARWOOD CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

City of Harwood, North Dakota

Regular Meeting

October 5, 2015

Pledge of Allegiance recited.

Call to Order/Roll Call. Mayor Bill Rohrich called the regular meeting to order @ 7:01 p.m. Council present: Ed Ployhart, Richard Sundberg, Jennifer Spiesz and Lori Peyerl. Also present Stan Hanson, Orville & Jo Ann Spiesz, Rolly Wall, Shana Wilson, Pat Samson, Alan Kemmet, Dan Newland, Pete & Darlene Meyer, Toni Maki, Heather Hames, Steve Olson, PWS Bernie Stasch, Auditor Sherry Morris and Deputy Auditor Cayla Mosser.

Consent Agenda: Motion by Ployhart to approved amended October Agenda to include discussion on fencing and/or storage building by waterplant, and to approve the September meeting minutes, August Financial Report and payment of October Bills/electronic transfers, *second* Spiesz. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **motion** carried.

Law Enforcement Report. September reported reviewed by Deputy Heather Hames with 26 calls as follows:

Deputy Hames reported a higher than usual number of crimes occurring in other small towns in the county. She said most could have been preventable; they weren't physical break-ins but had the ability to gain entrance to unlocked cars and property. She wanted residents to be aware that securing belongings will go a long way in reducing the opportunity for theft.

Engineer Report. Mr. Hanson reviewed progress of water/flood protection project. He reported aside from delay in demolition, construction timelines are being met. Walls and floors are up in underground storage tank and concrete lid/cover scheduled to be poured tomorrow. Oak circle house was demolished with some foundation work left to complete. Some trees will be cleared and grubbed on the back side of the house to allow easy access to the dike. The evergreen trees on the east side will be saved. All above items should be completed by end of this week and ditch work on Chapin/Hwy #81 starts next week.

Motion by Spiesz to approve Pay Request #3 to H&S Construction for \$89,653.50, *second* Peyerl. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Spiesz to readvertise for bids for installation of pumps, generator, pipe work and for the electrical work, limiting the cost to \$1500, *second* Sundberg. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **Motion** carried. Stan will work with Bernie on details and numbers for bids.

Park Board. Dan Newland discussed improvements to Community Center that would benefit the Park Board for its movie nights:Council agreed to work with and possibly partnership with Park Board to make these changes but asked that other funding options first be researched. Tabled.

Finalize 2016 Budget.

Motion by Spiesz to amend the City Policy Manual to change the employee/employer share paid for health, dental and vision insurance to 80% Employer paid/20%, Employee share, *second* Peyerl. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Spiesz to approve the Final 2016 Budget, with a levy of 75.35 Mills, -3.89 decrease from 2015 Budget, *second* Peyerl. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **motion** carried.

HARWOOD CITY COUNCIL MINUTES Cont.

Raffle Permit. Motion by Peyerl to approve Gaming Permit #1023 for Harwood PTO Bingo Night on November 1st at the Community Center, *second* Spiesz.

Building Permits.

Motion by Sundberg to approve Ployhart Building Permit #703 for a pole barn for cold storage; Tester & Holman Construction Permit #700 for new home; Nelson Permit #701 for enlarged garage door; and, Wall Permit #702 for 60x100 Foltz Building, *second* Peyerl. Motion carried.


Open Forum. Orville Spiesz again reminded the council how often people witness cars running the stop signs on the corner of Co. Hwy #81 and Cass Co. Hwy #22 and suggested flashing stop signs. Darlene Meyer requested publishing the monthly details from the monthly sheriff's reports in The Highlites for the benefit of residents. Pat Samson again requested the city take action for the safety of her neighborhood west of the river and get the county to reduce the speed and provide other safety devices.

Motion by Sundberg to contact County Engineer Jason Benson requesting the County reevaluate the county road speeds and signage and request response in 15 days; *second*, Ployhart. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, *motion* carried.

Reports. Bill Rohrich was again asked to contact the County to discuss extending the 25 mph speed zone from the bridge to the westerly city limits.

Ed Ployhart researched the cost of fencing along the east side of waterplant versus the option of getting up an additional cold storage building to resolve years of storage and remedy the unsightly area by the plant for the benefit of neighboring residences. Fencing was estimated at \$30,000. A 72' x 100' Foltz building could be put up for \$83,000 also solving the storage problem for city equipment. Discussion. Tabled.

Adjournment: Motion by Ployhart, to adjourn at 9:30 p.m. to the next regular meeting on November 2nd, *second* Spiesz.
