# HARWOOD CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

September 14, 2015

**Pledge of Allegiance** recited.

**Call to Order/Roll Call.** Mayor Bill Rohrich called the regular meeting to order on September 14, 2015 @ 7:00 p.m. Council present: Richard Sundberg, Jennifer Spiesz and Lori Peyerl. Also present Stan Hanson, Pete & Darlene Meyer, James Wolsky, Steve Olson, Cheryl Danskin, Cayla Mosser and Sherry Morris.

**Agenda.** Mayor Rohrich asked if anyone had any additions to Agenda.

**Motion** by Sundberg to approve the Agenda, with change in order to accommodate residents present to move their items of concern to the beginning, *second*, Spiesz.

**Variance Request.** Lori Peyerl reported the Planning & Zoning resulted in a recommendation to grant the Variance for 123 Bender Lane, to allow construction of a new garage that exceeds city ordinance maximum height limitation by 14'.

**Motion** by Spiesz to approve Variance for 123 Bender Lane, *second* Peyerl. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **Motion** carried.

## **Building Permit.**

**Motion** by Peyerl to approve Wolsky Building Permit 694 for garage; Helmick Permit #695 for concrete slab; Spiesz Permit #697 for porch addition; and Iwen Permit #698 for a garage and deck, all contingent on building inspector review, *second* Sundberg. Spiesz sustained from voting due to one building was for her. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **Motion** carried.

Dick Sundberg reported the need to monitor elevations for future garages and yard sheds noting the revised floodplain rules make it necessary to make sure additions do not jeopardize anyone's insurance rates by changing footprints and no longer qualifying for a LOMR-F.

**Consent Agenda.** **Motion** by Spiesz to approve the August meeting minutes and payment of September Bills/electronic transfers, *second* Peyerl. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **Motion** carried.

**Sheriff's Report.** Deputy Heather Hames presented the August sheriff's log showing 23 calls for service and asked if the city had any issues to address. Nothing was reported. Reviewed County Ordinance #2014-1 authorizing sheriffs to police public events granting the sheriff to determine the number, if any, of deputy sheriffs needed to police certain public events.

**Policy Manual.** Jennifer Spiesz noted language she found for council to consider changing on manual.

**Motion** by Spiesz to approve the revised Policy Manual, to include changes, *second* Spiesz. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **Motion** carried.

**Preliminary 2016 Budget.** Jennifer Spiesz in her capacity of the financial portfolio reported her review of the preliminary budget and presented recommended changes.

**Motion** by Jennifer to approve the 2016 Preliminary Budget, as amended, *second* by Peyerl. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **Motion** carried. Will continue review until final approval at regular October council meeting.

**Water Improvement #2015-1.** Stan Hanson reviewed project progress. Reached out to property owner of land purchased east of Chapin/corner of #81 to notify crews will soon be upgrading that area

for flood protection. Currently working on pouring walls for underground storage and plan to pulling off forms later this week; Stennes house removed with part of project funds being used to stabilize and move berm to the east of present location: abatement was needed before demolition of Thompson house to confirm no contamination of hazardous material. Test showed ceiling paint okay, but positive on linoleum in basement, some caulked areas, etc. Braun getting quote and hope to complete end of this week. Backhoe in place for demolition scheduled for week of September 20<sup>th</sup>-25<sup>th</sup>. Collecting quotes for water and compaction testing necessary for project. All will be competitive bids with local contractors taking priority. Week of Oct 15-23 connection will need to be made between the new underground storage and waterplant. At that time the city will experience limited pressure for a day or so; will work with the city to decide which day would be best to make the connection taking into consideration the school and peak times. As of now connection will be made during the night on a Friday for less disruption during the work week to accommodate the most residents.

**Motion** by Sundberg to approve the following payments: (1) Braun Intertec invoices totaling \$12,547.87; (2) H&S Contracting, Inc., Pay Request #2 totaling \$94,027.50; and, (3) Houston Engineering invoices totaling \$15,143.93, *second*, Peyerl. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **Motion** carried.

### **Annexation Plat.**

**Motion** by Spiesz to approve the Annexation Plat bringing in the Stennes property west of the waterplant into city limits, *second*, Peyerl. Upon roll call vote with all in favor, **Motion** carried.

**Preliminary Map Concerns.** Reviewed letter to FEMA from the Cass County Joint Water Resource District with signed support from Senator Hoeven and Heitkamp, Congressman Cramer, the regional FEMA administrator, Governor Dalrymple, the State Water Commission and numerous local officials requesting reevaluation of recent changes made on revised floodmapping for this area. Harwood stands in support of the requested changes Greg Theilman from Houston has identified on changes made east side of I-29 finding errors in the model.

**Community Center Lease.** A draft lease agreement between the City and J&J Salon reviewed, with basic change to names with current lease between salon and Community Center. Discussed CC need for separate thermostats to better regulate the temperature in the two office spaces. Jennifer suggested taking it one step further and have electrical meters in for renters to pay their own electric bill.

**Reports.** Jennifer Spiesz reported concerns from residents living on west Rivershore Drive whose basement is cracking and trees and propane tank are leaning as their yard sinks and her belief the city should address the problem if the cause is dike failure and asked if there are not things that can be done to prevent it from continuing. Dick Sundberg said he spoke with the residents last week and explained the city has spent thousands of dollars on studies and repair and already have the answer from years of study and work on that area and data concluding to repair the dike properly all homes west of Rivershore Drive would have to be removed to ensure a stable dike. We also have recent testing completed by Braun with regard to embankment on Thompson property that includes information showing no relationship with the dike failure and the cracked basement. Dick explained the riverbank is sliding causing the dike failures. Residents putting grass on the dike is further accelerating the sluffing occurring softening the area. It was asked if sheeting would work and it was said it is not very effective. Engineer Hanson, Dick Sundberg and Mayor Rohrich agreed to meet with residents Wednesday, Sept. 15<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m., to review the situation.

Mayor Rohrich asked Stan Hanson to look into the possibility of additional county funding.

Pete Meyer suggested the city check with Jay Helmick who works for Wanzek. Fill from ditch

work on '81 now being hauled to Reiles Acres. Stan said as part of our contracting with H&S it is up to them to import fill that meets specifications but agreed to visit with Bernie and ask Jay Helmick if that could be an option.

Mayor reported the candidate chosen for public works assistant declined the city's offer and asked that the help wanted ad for Bernie's position be rerun as soon as possible.

Sherry asked on behalf of the Park Board what the city wants to charge them to rent the Community Center for its Friday Night Movies and other events. It was the consensus of the council to offer the building for free in exchange for help with occasional cleaning and maintenance of the building, with council and Bernie's direction. Steve plans to start painting the hallway and restrooms in the Community Center the week of September 20<sup>th</sup>. Bernie removing, sanding and painting restroom stall walls. Will be attending with Cayla the NDLC convention next Thursday-Saturday.



# Marge's Tips Without a Fee

## Hi Everyone:

A new thing this month. A good old time recipe by our cooks of the past in Harwood, many of them gone. This one is from Mrs. Marie Johnson, Rt. 1, Fargo, ND

## Lefse

Potatoes—about 10, 1 cup of cream, 2 Tbsp. of sugar, Flour -3-1/2—4 cups, salt

Boil potatoes, drain well. Mash, with the cream, sugar and salt, until smooth and set aside to cool. Add enough flour to make a stiff dough. Use remaining flour for rolling lefse. Divide into 10 portions, roll thin and bake on a medium hot stove or griddle. Makes 10, enjoy!

## Strike Out Stroke with One Incredible Fruit!

## City Names:

**Bismarck (1873)** was originally named Edwinton in 1872. The following year it was renamed for the Chancellor of Germany, Prince Otto Eduard Leopold von Bismarck. The German name was adopted to attract German immigrants.

**Dickinson (1881)** was first named Pleasant Valley Siding but was renamed for New York land agent Wells Stoughton Dickinson. His brother, Horace Dickinson lived in the new town helping with early organization.

**Fargo (1872)** had first been called Tent City and Centralia, before receiving its lasting name for NP Railroad board member, businessman, founder of Wells Fargo Express and American Express Company, and former mayor of Buffalo NY, William George Fargo.

**Grand Forks(1860)** came from "Les Grandes Fourches" the name French trappers gave where the waters came together at the forks of the Red Lake River and the Red River. Steamboat Capt. Alexander Griggs owned most of the land in the original area.

**Jamestown (1871)** was named by a captain at Fort Steward to honor his hometown of Jamestown, Virginia.


