

July 2, 2018

Pledge of Allegiance: Recited.

Call to Order/Roll Call: At 7:00pm, Mayor Bill Rohrich called the meeting to order. Roll call included Dick Sundberg, Darlene Meyer, Blake Hankey and Jim Hughes. Others in attendance included Public Works Superintendent Bernie Stasch, Auditor Casey Eggermont, Attorney Sarah Wear, and Engineer Andrew Aakre.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the agenda by Sundberg, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed.

Approve May Bills, April Minutes, and Financial Report Consent Agenda: Motion to approve consent agenda by Sundberg, second by Meyer. All voted aye, and the motion passed. Board on motion approved the financial report:

Law Enforcement Report: Deputy Glenn Manning presented the monthly Adopt-A-Community report for June. For June, there were 2 traffic related incidents, 4 animal calls, 4 suspicious activity calls, 2 found property, 2 domestic calls, 1 fire call, 1 medical assistant call, 2 theft calls, 2 fireworks calls, and 1 vandalism call.

Old Business: No old business for this meeting.

New Business:

Oath of Office: Blake Hankey, Jim Hughes and Dick Sundberg took the Oath of Office for their newly elected City Council positions. Attorney Sarah Wear notarized the oaths.

Appoint Auditor, Attorney and City Engineer: Motion was made by Sundberg to appoint Sara Wear with Ohnstad-Twichell as the City Attorney, Casey Eggermont as the City Auditor, and Andrew Aakre with Moore Engineering as the City Engineer, seconded by Hughes. All voted aye, and the motion was passed.

Reassign Portfolio's to Councilmen: Consensus is to keep portfolios as they are currently assigned, with Mayor Bill Rohrich covering Media, Law Enforcement/Security, Equipment/Vehicles, and Personnel. Dick Sundberg will cover Emergency/Flood, Streets and Drainage, and Public Works. Jim Hughes will cover Water and Sewer, Waste, and Special Assessments. Darlene Meyer will cover Community Matters, Community Center, Forestry, Park Board and Animal Control. Blake Hankey will cover Nate Keller and Ernie Jury's portfolio's of Fire and Rescue Liaison, Health and Public Safety, Planning and Zoning, and Buildings and Grounds.

Building Permits: Two building permits were submitted to the council from Jennifer Soland for an egress window, and from Lee Wilson for replacing a storage shed. Hughes made a motion to approve Jennifer Soland's egress window permit, seconded by Sundberg. All voted aye, and the motion passed. The permit for Lee Wilson's was not approved until further research was done on the elevation and plans for the shed.

Repeat Delinquent Water Bills: Eggermont and Stasch relayed what the current process is of collecting on delinquent water bills. The process is that a standard postcard bill is mailed that describes their status. If a homeowner is 60 days past due, then a letter is sent out, on or around, the first of the month describing the situation, and if a payment is not made by approximately the 8th of the month, then a second letter is tagged onto the homeowner's front door with a notice that water will be turned off by a posted date, generally the 11th of the month. If payment is not made by 7:55am on the posted date, water will be turned off shortly after. The consensus is to keep the current routine.

Community Center Property Lines: Discussion was had over the property lines at the Community Center, due to concerns from the adjoining land owners. Stasch relayed that the lines are marked by green posts.

Public Works Report: Stasch relayed that the City of Fargo has been in contact with him regarding heightened levels of hydrogen sulfide gasses in a portion of the City of Harwood sewer system. The heightened levels were noticed on the south side of Dakota Avenue. Hughes requested that letters be sent to all businesses south of Dakota Avenue.

Stasch then relayed that the new riding mower has arrived, electricity in the storage building is completed, the control panel for the lift station has arrived, the new generator works great, the railroad company will be out within the month to fix the railroad crossing, and relayed what the approximate costs would be to move the grass clipping containers close to the shop. Stasch estimates that it will take approximately \$2000 for crushed concrete by the shop to host the large grass clipping bins.

Engineer's Report: Aakre had no report for this meeting.

Auditor's Report: Eggermont discussed the CRS/Floodplain Administrator training she attended in Bismarck, the 2019 budget projected revenue from state, completing the inventory list for the city, and the election.

Correspondence:

Fireworks Ordinance: A complaint was received from a resident regarding the current fireworks ordinance. The resident relayed the effect of fireworks on pets, and that the ordinance does not consider residents who need to work early in the morning. The consensus of the board is to leave the ordinance as is.

Portfolio Reports:

Meyer: Meyer relayed that the vinyl for the bathrooms will be installed soon from the insurance claim. She also thanked Stasch and Jeremy Snyder of Public Works for painting the doors of the Community Center. Meyer requested that the City renew the Sam's Club membership, since she purchases many cleaning and janitorial supplies from there. The consensus of the board was for Meyer to renew the membership.

Rohrich: Mayor Rohrich relayed that the closing date on 116 Oak Circle would be on August 1st, 2018. The home is being purchased by the City as a flood buyout home, and will allow the city to continue on flooding infrastructure.

Adjourn: Motion to adjourn by Hankey, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the meeting was adjourned at 9:14pm.

Special Meeting

July 25, 2018

Pledge of Allegiance: Recited.

Call to Order/Roll Call: At 6:00 pm, Mayor Bill Rohrich called the meeting to order. Roll call included Darlene Meyer, Blake Hankey and Jim Hughes. Others in attendance included Public Works Superintendent Bernie Stasch and Auditor Casey Eggermont.

Discussion and Decision on \$250,000 note through Harwood State Bank for 116 Oak Circle: Hughes made a motion to obtain a \$250,000 90 day loan at 3% interest to purchase the Tanner Residence at 116 Oak Circle. The motion was seconded by Meyer. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed. The closing date for the purchase is set for August 1st, 2018. The purchase will allow the city to move forward with future infrastructure projects that are focused around flooding of the Sheyenne River.

Discussion and Decision on the proposed 2019 Budget: Eggermont discussed the various pro's and con's of the proposed 2019 budget. The board requested minor calculation changes to view for the August regular meeting. Eggermont relayed that a decision will need to be made at the August meeting to meet state standards of submitting a proposed budget to the County Auditor by August 10th. She also relayed that once the city produces a proposed budgeted dollar amount of taxes to the County Auditor, the City can no longer tax any dollars higher than that amount submitted, but the City can cut the amount of dollars from the time of submission to the official budget hearing in October.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the agenda by Hansen, seconded by Hilde. All in favor voted aye, motion passed.

Review/Approve Meeting Minutes: Motion by Newland to approve the June meeting minutes, seconded by Hansen. All voted aye and the motion was passed.

Review/Approve Financial Report: Eggermont presented the financial report. As of July 12, 2018, the General Fund had a balance of \$20,789.89, the Special Revenue Fund had a balance of \$861.77, and the Park and Recreational Fund had a balance of \$11,955.30, and the Community Days Sub-Fund has a balance of \$1,000.00, bringing the total of all funds to \$34,606.96, which matches with the bank statement. Hansen made a motion to approve the financial report, seconded by Hilde. Motion carried.

Approve Payment of Bills: Newland made a motion to pay the bills as submitted, seconded by Meyer. All voted aye, and the motion carried.

Easy Peach Cobbler

Ingredients


- 1/2 cup unsalted butter
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups sugar, divided
- 1 Tbsp baking powder
- Pinch of salt
- 1 cup milk
- 4 cups fresh peach slices
- 1 Tbsp lemon juice
- Ground cinnamon or nutmeg (optional)

Melt butter in a 9x13 inch baking dish

Combine flour, 1 cup sugar. Baking powder and salt; add milk stirring until dry ingredients are moistened. Pour batter over butter (do not stir)

Bring remaining cup of sugar, peach slices and lemon juice to a boil over high heat. Stirring constantly; pour over batter (do not stir). Sprinkle with cinnamon, if desired.

Bake at 375 degrees for 40 to 45 minutes or until golden brown.




