



Regular Meeting

May 7, 2018

Pledge of Allegiance: Recited.

Call to Order/Roll Call: At 7:00pm, Mayor Bill Rohrich called the meeting to order. Roll call included Dick Sundberg, Darlene Meyer, Jim Hughes, Ernie Jury and Dick Sundberg. Others in attendance included Public Works Superintendent Bernie Stasch, Auditor Casey Eggermont, Attorney Sarah Wear, and Engineer Andrew Aakre.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the agenda by Meyer, seconded by Sundberg. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed.

Approve May Bills, April Minutes, and Financial Report Consent Agenda: Motion to approve consent agenda by Sundberg, second by Meyer. All voted aye, and the motion passed.

Law Enforcement Report: Deputy Glenn Manning presented the monthly Adopt-A-Community report for April. For April, there were 13 traffic related incidents, 2 animal calls, 2 suspicious activity calls, 1 domestic, 1 juvenile complaint, 1 theft, 1 found property, 1 mental health CFS, and 1 loud party.

Old Business: Fireworks: Discussion ensued over final paperwork and agreement with Mike Kvanvig. Meyer relayed that her and Kvanvig agreed to \$2000 for rent this year only and to pay the additional building insurance through Dawson Insurance for \$1500.

New Business: Harwood Fire & Rescue: Fire Chief Marc Mosser and Assistant Fire Chief Brian Giere, along with many of the fire department crew, attended the meeting to give a presentation on every aspect of the Harwood Fire Department. Giere discussed the ins and outs of the fire department equipment, gear, and volunteers. The board appreciated the Fire & Rescue's presentation and explanation of the department's budget.

Harwood Fire & Rescue Gaming Site Permit: Hughes made a motion to approve the Harwood Fire & Rescue gaming site permit, seconded by Sundberg. All voted aye, and the motion passed.

Building Permits: Two building permits were submitted for approval. Permits for 104 Riverwood Drive and 112 Riverwood Drive were reviewed, and both did not have the flood elevation on the permits. Jury made a motion to approve the permits contingent on receiving the flood elevation for both homes, seconded by Hughes. All voted aye, and the motion passed.

County Sales Tax Meeting/Buyout: Mayor Rohrich relayed that Mrs. Tanner's son had been in contact with him regarding selling his mother's house to the City of Harwood. Rohrich discussed that he would like to start negotiations to purchase the property, so the City can work on the levy located in the river behind the Tanner residence at 116 Oak Circle. Sundberg made a motion for Rohrich to start negotiations for acquiring the property, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the motion carried.

Flood Proofing Code: The discussion was brought up that there is no official flood proof code in the Harwood City Ordinances. Aakre suggested that the city adopt the current flood proofing code that is done in neighboring cities.

Sign the 2018 Diversion Resolution: The consensus of the board was to have Mayor Rohrich sign the 2018 Diversion Resolution from the City of Harwood. Rohrich signed the resolution.

Public Works Report: Stasch requested that electricity be installed in the cold storage shed by JDP Electric. Hughes made a motion to approve the installation, seconded by Sundberg. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed. Stasch then requested to trade in the city's current John Deere lawnmower for a new mower with all the same features, due to the current mower having multiple fixes. Hughes made a motion to purchase the new lawnmower and trade the old one, seconded by Meyer. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passes. Stasch then requested to have lights installed for the Community Center and the City Shop. Meyer made a motion to approve the installation of lights in both the Community Center and City Shop, seconded by Sundberg. All in favor voted aye, and the motion carried. The discussion of grass clipping bins came up, with Stasch in favor of moving the bins to be close to the shop next year. The board discussed the materials needed to host the bins in the area, and Stasch relayed that crushed concrete would be needed to hold the bins. Sundberg made a motion to purchase crushed concrete not exceeding \$2000, seconded by Meyer. All in favor voted aye, and the motion carried.

Engineer's Report: Aakre reported that he is currently working on documents for the Community Block Development Grant (CBDG) for the possible upcoming sewer/levy project. Rohrich and Eggermont signed the requested documents.

Auditor's Report: Eggermont relayed the items worked on for the last month, including the City Wide Garage Sale, the Harwood Highlites fundraiser turnout, planting flowers by the "City of Harwood" sign by the fire department, and the upcoming 2019 budget season. Eggermont then asked the council for a motion to create a fund specifically for the Community Center. She relayed that reason this has been requested is mainly due to transparency. The public can currently request reports of what the Community Center is taking in for revenue and what it is spending, which is all kept within the General Fund. Eggermont relayed that she talked to Harold Rotunda regarding creating a fund specifically for the Community Center, and Rotunda relayed that this would be fine as long as the board doesn't choose to revert its decision and put all the expenses and revenues back into the general fund. The pro of having the Community Center as its own separate fund would give the council a balance to look at on their monthly cash balance report, whereas it takes a minor amount of work to do the process currently. Hughes made a motion to create a fund specifically for the Community Center, seconded by Meyer. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed.

Correspondence: Verizon Wireless Plan: Eggermont relayed that the current phone plan is consistently being charged with overages on data. On the current plan, Eggermont and Stasch are allowed to share 6GB. Verizon suggested an unlimited plan, which would be cheaper than the current plan with the numerous overages. The general consensus was to switch to the unlimited plan.

Portfolio Reports: Hughes: Hughes relayed that he would like up to a \$1000 limit to purchase treats for the upcoming Water Treatment Plant Open House on May 24th. The consensus of the board was to allow the purchase of any items needed up to \$1000.

Meyer: Meyer requested to purchase flowers for the Community Center, and to have maintenance done on the dishwasher at the Community Center. The consensus of the board was to allow both the purchase of flowers and the maintenance on the dishwasher.

Sundberg: Sundberg relayed that he had an interview with AE2S in regards to the water diversion project.

Adjourn: Motion to adjourn by Sundberg, seconded by Meyer. All in favor voted aye, and the meeting was adjourned at 10:54pm.

SPECIAL MEETING

May 22, 2018

Call to Order/Roll Call: At 12:00pm, Mayor Bill Rohrich called the meeting to order. Roll call included Dick Sundberg, Darlene Meyer, Jim Hughes, and Dick Sundberg. Members absent: Ernie Jury. Others in attendance included Auditor Casey Eggermont.

Discussion regarding the Tanner Residence purchase (116 Oak

Circle): Mayor Bill Rohrich discussed the opportunity to purchase 116 Oak Circle. The benefit of purchasing the property is to enhance the levy near that location. Rohrich relayed that the City would have to contribute half of the costs for the property. After speaking with the Tanner family, Rohrich relayed that, after negotiations, they agreed to sell the property for \$250,000. The City would be responsible for \$125,000, and approximately \$3500 for closing costs and attorney fees.

Decision regarding the Tanner Residence purchase: Sundberg made a motion to purchase the Tanner residence, also known as 116 Oak Circle, with the understanding that the house on the property is to remain sellable, seconded by Hughes. Upon roll call vote, members of the board who voted aye were Sundberg, Hughes and Meyer. Majority of the board voted for the purchase, and the motion passed.

Adjourn: Motion to adjourn by Hughes, seconded by Sundberg. All in favor voted aye, and the meeting was adjourned at 12:22pm.

**Here are a few friendly reminders to residents of
Harwood in regards to policies and ordinances:**

BRANCH PICKUP & GRASS CLIPPINGS

Branch pickup will run every other Wednesday until snowfall (see community calendar for dates). Please place branches at end of driveway in manageable lengths no longer than 8' (bundling isn't necessary). Branches in an area difficult for tractor access such as the bottom of ditches will not be picked up. It is not necessary to tie & bundle piles.

Yard waste (grass, leaves, garden trimmings, excess fruits and vegetables) can be hauled to the grass recycling site east of the Fire Hall. Please remove waste from bags and place bags in the totes provided. If dumpsters are full, do not leave bags on the ground. Roll-offs will be emptied on a regular basis. This service is for city residents only paid for through residential waste rates.

PETS

Please keep your pets detained, and not running at large, and pets cannot be habitually barking, crying or howling. Also, please pick up after your pet if they are out on a walk with you (please be courteous and pick up after your pets). Full set of ordinances can be found www.cityofharwood.com.

FIREWORKS

- Fireworks can be used June 27th-July 5th within city limits.
- The times you can use fireworks from June 27th-July 2nd, and on July 5th are from 8:00am to 10:30pm.

Basic Garden Preparation Steps

- 1** Test soil fertility (contact county Extension office for information). Till soil if needed.
- 2** Select seeds or transplants. Some plants are annuals, biennials or perennials. Knowing what season they are grown and harvested in affects the short- and long-term plan for the garden.
- 3** Determine the planting layout in the garden. Different layouts are suitable for different plants. Some examples are: furrow, square foot or hill planting. Also, some plants require trellises or cages to support growth.

When to Plant

Most plants are best planted in May.

- The first 2½ weeks in May are best for leafy greens (such as lettuce, chard, spinach) and beets, carrots and potatoes.
- The last weeks in May are best for beans, squash, pumpkins, cucumbers and tomatoes.
- Consult the seed packet, or a garden center or plant nursery for additional planting information on specific plants.

Tools to Get Children Started

- Child-sized gloves
- Child-sized trowel
- Child-sized rake
- Child-sized watering can
- Soil and fertilizer as needed
- Plants or seeds
- Pots (optional)
- Long-sleeved shirt, pants and closed-toe shoes

Consider What Works for Your Family

Community Garden – If you don't have a personal garden area on your property, you may be able to enjoy a garden plot in a community garden.

Containers – Using containers or pots may be a good option if you have limited space or access to community gardens.

Compost – If you have a garden on your property, building and maintaining a compost pile or box is a great way to use organic materials to enrich your plant soil. Compost requires soil and raw organic matter, such as leaves, grass clippings, and vegetable and fruit peelings.

What to do with all the fruits and vegetables you grow

Garden Chili

- ½ pound lean hamburger
- 1 c. chopped onion
- ½ c. potatoes, cut into small cubes
- 1 15-ounce can dark kidney beans
- 1½ c. diced tomatoes, blanch to remove skins
- 15-ounce can or about 2 c. tomato sauce
- ½ c. chopped green peppers
- 1 c. of water
- 1 Tbsp. chili powder
- 1 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- ½ tsp. cumin, ground
- ½ tsp. black pepper

Brown hamburger and onion in saucepan over medium heat. Blanch fresh tomatoes by removing stems and scoring bottom of tomato; boil one minute, immediately place in cold water, remove skins. Add remaining ingredients, bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer for 30 minutes.

Makes eight servings. Each serving has 170 calories, 22 grams (g) carbohydrate, 3 g fat, 1 g saturated fat, 14 g protein, 6 g fiber and 460 milligrams sodium.

Children enjoy eating their freshly grown fruit and vegetables. All garden produce should be washed with plenty of cold water before you eat it. You can store washed and drained produce in airtight containers in the refrigerator to keep them fresh and ready to eat for healthful snacks.

Tomatoes, onions, potatoes and winter squash should not be stored in the refrigerator; instead they should be stored in a cool, dark place.

Methods of Preserving Your Produce

Can fruits and vegetables in sterilized jars with proper canning equipment, using current guidelines. Canned produce should be used within one year and stored in a dark, dry place between 50 and 70 F for best quality.

Dehydrate fruits and vegetables in a dehydrator and store them in a cool, dark, dry place. Fruit can be stored for about six months at 80 F or one year at 60 F.

Freeze fruits and vegetables as soon as possible after harvesting them. Blanch vegetables (boil vegetables, followed immediately by cooling them in ice water) before freezing for best quality. Boiling time varies by vegetable type. Produce freezer life varies. Produce can last eight to 12 months at 0 F.

Useful Terms

Annual – planted and harvested in one season (spinach, tomatoes, peas)

Perennial – grows back each season without planting for several years (asparagus, rhubarb)

Transplants – young plants for purchase that have started growing in a plant nursery or garden center

Furrow – most common method of planting; plants are in a straight row

Square foot – planting method of dividing the garden into 4- by 4-foot squares and planting one variety within the square

Hill – method of planting in a circle, not raised; good for large vegetables, vine vegetables or fruit
