




# HARWOOD CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

*City of Harwood, North Dakota*



## **Regular Meeting**

**February 5, 2018**

**Pledge of Allegiance:** Recited.

**Call to Order/Roll Call:** At 7:00pm, Councilman Dick Sundberg called the meeting to order. Roll call included Dick Sundberg, Darlene Meyer, Jim Hughes, Ernie Jury and Mayor Bill Rohrich via phone. Others in attendance included Public Works Superintendent Bernie Stasch, Auditor Casey Eggermont, and Attorney Sarah Wear.

**Approve Agenda:** Hughes requested to add discussion during the Public Works Report. Motion to approve the agenda with the addition by Meyer, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed.

**Approve February Bills, January Minutes, and Financial Report Consent Agenda:** Motion to approve consent agenda by Hughes, second by Jury. All voted aye, and the motion passed.

### **Old Business:**

**Policy Manual:** Final revisions and amendments were submitted to the board. Motion by Jury to accept the Policy Manual as presented, seconded by Meyer. All voted aye, motion approved.

### **New Business:**

#### **Community Center:**

**Fireworks:** Motion to approve the selling of Fireworks in June/July, contingent upon approval from attorney and insurance.

**Locks/Keys:** The idea of having a lock box for keys at the Community Center was discussed. The consensus of the council was to have Meyer and Stasch work together on this project. Reasons for the project are to make Community Center rentals easier on both the council and renters.

**Stage Covering:** Meyer requested to have the stage recovered that is located in the Community Center. The general consensus of the board was to have Meyer and Stasch work on this project together as long as the cost of the project is under \$1000.

**Harwood Fire and Rescue Fundraiser—Gaming Permit:** Motion to approve by Hughes, second by Jury. All voted aye, and the motion carried.

**Public Works Report:** Stasch relayed that the Public Works crew has been working in the water plant and has been cleaning pipes. Stasch communicated that water has been discolored due to cleaning the pipes. Parking on the streets has been difficult on Rivershore Drive, as well as Alice Lane. Projects at the Community Center will also be keeping Public Works busy. Hughes requested reports for water and sewer gallons used, whether it's per month or quarter. Stasch and Eggermont will work on requesting a report from City of Fargo.

**Auditor Report:** Eggermont reported that all end of year reports are completed. She also reported that Harold Rotunda has visited and received end of year reports for 2017. Eggermont will be attending the March Madness conference in March.

**Specials on Ag Land within City Limits:** Discussion ensued over the process of applying special assessments to agriculture land located within Harwood City limits.



# WEST FARGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS 2018-2019 KINDERGARTEN PRE-REGISTRATION

**Monday, March 19 • 4:30PM - 7:30PM**  
**Tuesday, March 20 • 4:30PM - 7:30PM**

**Bring the following documents along with you to pre-registration:**

**1. Child's Proof of Identity**

*Examples: Certified birth certificate, visa, I-94, or other government issued ID*

**2. Child's Current Immunization Record**

*North Dakota's "No Shots: No School Attendance" law requires that children be properly immunized or be in the process of being immunized before school starts. This law is enforced throughout West Fargo Public Schools.*

**Note: You are still able to pre-register without these documents.**

Kindergarten will be offered at all elementary schools for the 2018-2019 school year. For this pre-registration event, all students living north of I-94, with the exception of Harwood Elementary School, will pre-register at Cheney Middle School. All students living south of I-94, with the exception of Horace Elementary School, will pre-register at Liberty Middle School. Harwood Elementary School and Horace Elementary School will pre-register their own students during this event. **Children must be five years old on, or before, July 31, 2018, to attend kindergarten in 2018-2019.**

If you do not know which school your child will attend, enter your address online at <https://www.west-fargo.k12.nd.us/registration>. Pre-registration is an opportunity for parents to complete the necessary paperwork; students need not attend. Students and families will be invited back to meet staff and tour the schools at August's Back to School Night.


