

## Regular Meeting

April 2, 2018

**Pledge of Allegiance:** Recited.

**Call to Order/Roll Call:** At 7:00pm, Mayor Bill Rohrich called the meeting to order. Roll call included Dick Sundberg, Darlene Meyer, Jim Hughes, Ernie Jury and Dick Sundberg. Others in attendance included Public Works Superintendent Bernie Stasch, Auditor Casey Eggermont, Attorney Sarah Wear, and Engineer Andrew Aakre.

**Approve Agenda:** Motion to approve the agenda by Sundberg, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed.

**Approve April Bills, March Minutes, and Financial Report Consent Agenda:** Motion to approve consent agenda by Hughes, second by Sundberg. All voted aye, and the motion passed.

**Diversion Discussion/Updates:** Jason Benson, Cass County Engineer, attended the meeting to give the Harwood City Council and updated on the diversion project. Benson discussed the pro's and con's of each option of the project. A consensus of the board was to

draft a letter to the Flood Diversion Board of Authority, discussing the viewpoint of the City of Harwood in which plan is favorable. Sundberg and Eggermont agreed to work on the letter together.

**Board of Equalization Meeting:** Mayor Rohrich recessed the regular meeting, and called to order the 2018 Board of Equalization Meeting. The Board met at 7:45pm on April 2, 2018. Present were Mayor Bill Rohrich, Councilman Dick Sundberg, Councilman Jim Hughes, Councilman Darlene Meyer, Councilman Ernie Jury, Cass County Director of Equalization Paul Fracassi, Cass County Assessor Greg Landa, and Auditor Casey Eggermont. Fracassi discussed the increases and decreases in the separate areas of property. The total true and full value presented increased from \$69,982,300 in 2017 to \$71,561,400 in 2018, for a total increase of \$1,579,100. The total assessed value presented increased by \$789,550, for a total taxable value of \$6,245,012 for the 2018 year. Motion by Sundberg to accept the proposed values, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the motion was passed. Motion by Sundberg to adjourn the Board of Equalization meeting, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the meeting was adjourned.

**Harold Rotunda—2017 Audit:** Harold Rotunda discussed the 2017 audit for the City of Harwood. The board was pleased with the turnout.

### **Old Business:**

**Fireworks:** Discussion ensued over Mike Kvanvig and the firework sales. The consensus was to have Meyer negotiate pricing and all paperwork with Kvanvig.

### **New Business:**

**Building Permits:** Motion by Sundberg to approve Jennifer Spiesz' building permit #746, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed.

Motion by Sundberg to approve the Verizon Wireless building permit #747, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed.

Motion by Sundberg to approve Rachel Ulmer's building permit #748, seconded by Hughes. All in favor voted aye, and the motion passed.

### **Correspondence:**

**Discussion regarding Natural Gas:** Eggermont relayed questions regarding the input of natural gas lines to the City of Harwood. The general consensus was not to look into tapping into natural gas at this time due to costs.

**Portfolio Reports:** Jury: Discussed his findings of the Harwood Fire Department's finances, voting records and overall operations of the Fire Department. Jury relayed that he believes that the department can run on fewer dollars from the City. The consensus was to invite the Fire Department to a city council meeting before budget time.

**Announcements:** 1) Election forms due to Eggermont by April 9<sup>th</sup> at 4:00pm. 2) Blood Drive is on April 27<sup>th</sup> at the Harwood Community Center. 3) Fire Department Fundraiser on April 28<sup>th</sup>. 4) City Wide Rummage Sale on May 5<sup>th</sup>

**Adjourn:** Motion to adjourn by Hughes, seconded by Sundberg. All in favor voted aye, and the meeting was adjourned at 10:13pm.
