

MONDAY, - All items west of the interstate will be picked up.

TUESDAY, - All items east of the interstate to the RR tracks

WEDNESDAY, - All items east of the RR tracks.

- ✓ Everything you intend to dispose of *must be out by 7 a.m. on your pickup day. TRUCKS WILL ONLY PASS EACH STREET ONCE.*
- ✓ Pile items at end of driveways separating appliances from other debris for easier sorting and hauling
- ✓ No tires or concrete will be accepted
- ✓ Doors must be removed from freezers and refrigerators
- ✓ No items will be picked up that are on trailers or in the bottom of ditches
- ✓ No waste oil, paints, varnishes or other household hazardous waste
- ✓ This service is for Harwood city limits residents only paid for through residential waste and surcharge fees.

\*Hazardous waste items can be taken to Fargo's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection facility, 606 43 ½ St. N (east of Fargo landfill/compost site on south side of 7th Ave). When Buffalo River Race Park in Glyndon, MN opens its 65<sup>th</sup> season of racing on Saturday, May 11<sup>th</sup>, it will mark the beginning of a new era. For the first time in nearly seven decades, the quarter-mile dirt track will host its weekly racing on Saturday nights. Hoping to boost ticket sales, the group who runs the track felt a change in race night would be beneficial.

Racing will take place every Saturday night throughout the summer, though two Sunday night shows dot the calendar, on Memorial Day weekend, and Labor Day weekend, respectively. Several Harwood racers will be in attendance every Saturday night and a variety of racing divisions will make up the night of racing. Buffalo River Race Park is managed by former Harwood resident Kevin Nathe. Race night classes include: IMCA Modifieds, IMCA Sport Mods, IMCA Hobby Stocks, IMCA Sport Compacts, Slingshots, Lightning Sprints, and INEX Legends. Red River Valley Speedway in West Fargo is gearing up for a spectacular summer of Friday night racing, as the track hosts several action-packed classes of racing on each race night, but will also play host to the World of Outlaws Sprint Cars in late August, the Northern Outlaw Sprint Cars during the Red River Valley Fair, IMCA Sprint Cars at the end of May, non-winged Sprint Cars the first Friday in June, and Lightning Sprints, which are smaller versions of Sprint Cars and have motorcycle engines. We also have two dirt tracks an hour north and an hour southeast of Harwood, as River Cities Speedway in Grand Forks, ND and I-94 Speedway in Fergus Falls, MN play host to some great racing throughout the year on Friday nights and host several special events throughout the summer. 

## MEETING RECESSED TO BEGIN BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MEETING

**Law Enforcement Report:** Deputy Joe Koerber presented the March 2019 Calls for Service report. He reported that for the Harwood area, there was 3 suspicious activity calls, 4 public assists, 6 traffic complaints, 2 vandalism calls, 1 disturbance call, 1 domestic call, 1 fraud call and 15 traffic stops.

### New Business:

**Bike Path Discussion with Bolton-Menk (Metro COG):** Representatives from Bolton-Menk approached the board with a request to do research on a possible bike path around Harwood from Fargo. The boards consensus was to allow the firm to do their research, and that a bike path would be a good idea.

**Mike Kvanvig with Red Dragon Fireworks:** Mike Kvanvig approached the board with a request to rent the Harwood Community Center from June 25 to June 5 to sell fireworks. Kvanvig relayed to the board that the hours of operation will be from 10:00am to 10:00pm every day, and that they have already worked with Jay Kleingartner at Dawson Insurance to be fully insured while using the Community Center. The consensus of the board is to allow Kvanvig to rent the Community Center for the requested amount of time.

**Payoff Community Center/City Hall Discussion:** Meyer wanted to discuss the option of paying off the Community Center or City Hall. Currently, both loans are under \$40,000 each.

### Old Business:

**Aggressive Dog Ordinance/Update on Ordinances:** This item is tabled until May.

**Update Community Center Contract:** Discussion ensued over a new rental contract being put in place for J&J Salon, based out of the Community Center. The council discussed that the rental rate has not increased in many years, and that they do not believe the city owns a key to the room. The board also discussed that eventually the Community Center will need an inspection per ISO requirements.

**Public Works Report:** Stasch had no report.

**Engineer Report:** Moore Engineering engineer Andrew Aakre relayed that there is no recent activity on the Tanner home project, located at 116 Oak Circle. Aakre went on to discuss that bid opening for the Sewer Improvement District No. 2019-1 project would be happening on April 18, 2019 at 11:00am at Harwood City Hall, and that work on the Cass County Sales Tax Flood Risk Reduction Project had commenced, including preparing and submitting an additional project to the county in March for consideration later this spring. The project involves reconstruction of the Sheyenne River levee northwest of the Tanner property.


9 x 13 Greased Pan


